MOSJI Updates

Virtual meetings

- Several chapters have begun using our Zoom account for virtual meetings and have reported back that they went well. We did experience one startup problem, but it did not prevent that meeting from taking place. One point to keep in mind if you are going to show content such as YouTube videos or other on-line material that includes audio as part of your meeting, Zoom will not pass the audio through to the participants as it is expecting the audio to come from your microphone. You will have to switch the outgoing audio from the microphone to what is referred to as “Stereo Mix” on most computers and then switch it back when you want to use your microphone.
- If there are chapters that would like to use the account that have not already reserved a time, there are time slots available on Mondays after March 15th and all Tuesdays and Fridays.

Chapter News

- Holy Apostles chapter in Cranston will be conducting a consecration to St Joseph program on Mondays from 7:00 – 8:00 PM starting February 15th and running through March 15th.

Gospel Reading for February 10, 2021

Mk 7: 14-23

Jesus summoned the crowd again and said to them,
“Hear me, all of you, and understand.

Make Time for St. Joseph

Pope Francis on December 8, 2020 announced a special year dedicated to St. Joseph starting with the announcement and lasting through December 8, 2021, the feast of the Immaculate Conception. The special year marks the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of St. Joseph as the Patron of the Universal Church.

The Apostolic Penitentiary also issued a decree granting special indulgences for the duration of the special year to celebrate the anniversary and "to perpetuate the entrustment of the whole Church to the powerful patronage of the Custodian of Jesus."

During this period, the faithful will have the opportunity to commit themselves "with prayer and good works, to obtain, with the help of St. Joseph, head of the heavenly Family of Nazareth, comfort and relief from the serious human and social tribulations that besiege the contemporary world today."

Conditions for the plenary indulgence

The plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the Pope's intentions) to Christians who, with a spirit detached from any sin, participate in the Year of St. Joseph on these occasions and manners indicated by the Apostolic Penitentiary:

– The plenary indulgence is granted to those who will meditate for at least 30 minutes on the Lord's Prayer or take part in a Spiritual Retreat of at least one day that includes a meditation on St. Joseph. "St. Joseph, an authentic man of faith, invites us", the decree reads, "to rediscover our filial relationship with the Father, to renew fidelity to prayer, to listen and correspond with profound discernment to God's will."

– The indulgence can also be obtained by those who, following St. Joseph’s example, will perform a spiritual or corporal work of mercy. St. Joseph “encourages us to rediscover the value of silence, prudence, **and loyalty** in carrying out our duties.”

Here are some suggestions for traditions you take part in, prayers you can add to your daily prayer time and actions you can take to make St Joseph an active part of your life as a Man of St Joseph

Wednesday Dedication to St. Joseph

Holy Mother Church in Her liturgical tradition has attributed different days of the week as particular focal points for reflection. Holy Mother Church has given **Wednesday**, “the day the week turns on” to St. Joseph. This means that the middle of the week is the perfect time to reflect on, be grateful for, and intercede on behalf of holy fatherhood, both spiritual and biological. Why not consider going to weekday Mass on Wednesdays

March: The Month of St. Joseph

In a similar way the Church has assigned a special emphasis to each month of the calendar year. The month of March is known as the Month of St. Joseph and is marked by the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary on March 19th. Consider going to Mass as a group with your chapter brothers on the 19th and treat yourselves with the traditional Zeppole.



May 1st St Joseph, the patron saint of Workers

Consider attending Mass as a chapter and offer to do the readings. Invite men of the parish to learn more about the Men of St Joseph.

Make a Daily Novena Prayer to St. Joseph

O Saint Joseph, whose protection is so great, so strong, so prompt before the throne of God, I place in you all my interests and desires.

O Saint Joseph do assist me by your powerful intercession and obtain for me from your divine Son all spiritual blessings through Jesus Christ, Our Lord, so that having experienced here below your heavenly power, I may offer my thanksgiving and homage to the most loving of fathers.

O Saint Joseph, I never weary of contemplating you and Jesus asleep in your arms. I dare not approach while He reposes near your heart. Hold Him close in my name and kiss His fine head from me and ask Him to return the kiss when I draw my dying breath. St. Joseph, patron of departing souls, pray for me. Amen.

If you have not already done so make the commitment to making a consecration to St Joseph



ROAD TRIP! (kind-a ☺)



Are you suffering from cabin fever...COVID weary...or maybe just a case of the old-fashioned winter blahs? It's time to get out there and do something different! Why not head out for an afternoon at La Salette Shrine located at 947 Park Street in Attleboro, MA. But isn't that for Christmas lights? Yes, but there is a whole lot more there. For me personally it is very special place. It was there back in 2005 that my life was forever changed. I was a chaperone at a Steubenville Catholic youth conference and during Eucharistic Adoration the Holy Spirit made His presence known to me in an undeniable way...my life has never been the same. I suggest you start your visit by going to the **12:10 mass followed by Confession from 1:00-2:00**. Both are offered within the church building Monday-Friday. After that you can stroll out about 300 feet behind and to the left of the church (and pond) to spend some time with the **statue of our model leader, St. Joseph**. It is a large white statue on a grassy area. An idea might be to pray the Litany of St. Joseph. After that, head for the walking trail. Continue about another 300 feet to the left and you will find your way to the **Attleboro Springs Wildlife Sanctuary at La Salette**. The signs pointing you there are not great, but it is there if you look. It is a simple 15–20-minute circular walk on very flat ground and well-marked...pretty in the summer for sure. After that you can head over to **Bliss Dairy** restaurant located ½ mile away.... great ice cream!
